# **Operation Santa Claus – A Huge Success**

Each year, through the **Operation Santa Claus Program**, the Chinese American Council of Sacramento (CACS) sponsors about 60 needy families by providing them a \$50 gift certificate for their holiday meal and gifts for the kids in each family. This year, because of the economic downturn, CACS received an unprecedented 134 applications from kids of all ethnic backgrounds requesting assistance for the holiday season!

This number would have imposed a hardship on the CACS budget had it not been for the generous donations from so many caring individuals who stepped up and made contributions towards this program. Sacramento County Supervisor Jimmie Yee made a very generous donation of \$1,000 and individuals from the Sacramento City Fire Department donated over \$800. Other donations ranged from \$10 to \$500, which was enough to make up the deficit of our budget and allowed us to sponsor "all" 134 families. It was a daunting task just to shop for so many families but our dedicated volunteers made it possible.

Those eight years represented hundreds of hours of research, interviews, and travel. What a wonderful journey it was. The book contains over 180 illustrations and photos. We learned so much, made new friends, and renewed some old acquaintances.

"CANTON FOOTPRINTS" - Sacramento's Chinese Legacy" was written as a tribute to the courageous pioneers who first ventured to America to make Sacramento our home. It represents several generations of Chinese-Sacramentans that broke down the barriers of prejudice and hate. Wonderful heartwarming glimpses into the lives of our friends and neighbors put the issues of today into perspective Think about how much you would endure or pay, to bring your family over from China. These pioneers and their accomplishments were in danger of being forgotten.

The book was debuted at our annual Author/Lecture Dinner in June with 240 people in attendance. The community's response has been overwhelming and positive. CACS, with the help of many friends like Lana Chong and Florence Fong, has sold almost 1500 copies of Canton Footprints
